

Lolita Skirt Class Supply List

Sewing Box

A sewing box is recommended if student plans on attending more than one class, and/or has an ongoing interest in sewing.

- * Pencil and Notepad- useful to take notes and remember helpful hints
- * Fabric Scissors- important to have scissors that are only used on fabric to keep them sharp
- * Paper Scissors- scissors for everything else but fabric
- * See-Through Quilter's Drafting Ruler- essential for pattern alterations, and sewing projects
- * Long Handle Seam Ripper- they come in all sizes, but one with a long handle is the easiest to use
- * Long pins w/ glass head- are visible in most fabrics, can be ironed over without melting
- * Marking Tools- dressmaker chalk, fabric pencils, tracing wheel and paper, disappearing ink, etc.
Choose the tools that work best on your fabric.
- * Tape Measure- I like retractable ones because they are tidy, but you can use any Sewing Tape Measure
- * Thread Snips- useful to keep by your machine or around your neck to cut your threads and keep your project neat
- * Machine Needles- choose needles appropriate for the fabric and machine
- * Seam Guide- for measuring hems
- * Bobbins- please bring bobbins appropriate for the machine you will be using in class; whether it is your personal machine or one from Piedmont Sewing School.
- * Regular, Zig Zag, and Zipper feet- if your are bringing your own machine
- * If you are bringing your own machine, please bring the manual- you can print most manuals online if you don't have one.

Project Supplies for Lolita Skirt

- * Paradiso Designs Lolita Skirt (Don't worry if you don't have a pattern for the class, the skirt is a formula with rectangles. You can get a pattern later, when you want to make another.)
- * The back of the pattern reads "The Lolita skirt can be made out of lightweight fabrics including cotton, linen, silk, rayon, lightweight denim and lightweight wool. Make sure that you are crazy with joy at the way the skirt body fabric looks with the bottom contrast fabric and the pop trim! It will be a given that this will be your favorite skirt."
- * Skirt Body: 1 1/4-1 1/2 yard Fabric- pre-washed and dried
- * Skirt Contrast Bottom: 1/2 yard Fabric- pre-washed and dried
- * Pop Trim: 1/2 yard of fabric OR 3 yards of 1 1/2-2 1/2" wide trim (rick-rack, lace, etc.)
- * 3/4"-1" Wide Elastic: Your waist measurement (or wherever you want to wear your skirt) plus 1"
- * Thread to match your project-
- * Gutermann or another top quality thread
